# Your Plan, Your Planet



### Laptop

A plugged-in, snoozing laptop still uses 57 kWh of energy each year. That much energy produces the same about of CO<sub>2</sub>e as driving your car for over an hour.



### Gaming console

When you're done playing video games, unplug your console to save over 96 kWh of energy a year. That much energy produces the same amount of CO<sub>2</sub>e as driving your car for over 2 hours.



### Microwave

The average American household could save \$165 on their electricity bill each year by unplugging idle devices.



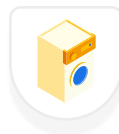
### Charger

Plug your chargers into a power strip or smart outlet, so when they're not in use, you can turn them off easily.



### TV

You might not think of it, but by unplugging your TV when it's off, you could save 104 kWh of energy every year. That much energy produces the same about of CO<sub>2</sub>e as driving your car for 2 ½ hours.



### Washing machine

American households' idle energy use is the equivalent of the energy generated by 50 large power plants in a year.
